ADMINISTRATIVE PLAN

8th District Pope County District Court

1. JUDGES.

The Pope County District Court is a state district court served by one judge, Clayton McCall. The judge serves in the statutorily designated departments of Russellville, Dover, Atkins, London, Pottsville and the greater area of Pope County.

Traffic tickets and criminal cases are heard at each department. Civil and Small claims cases are only heard at the Russellville Department location located at 1506 East 2nd Street, Russellville, Arkansas, in the county seat, on Thursdays at 1:30 PM.

The statutory authority for the organization and designation of this district court is found is found at A.C.A. § 16-17-1110 et. seq.

3. ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 18 REFERRALS FROM CIRCUIT COURT.

Criminal. The following duties are referred with respect to an investigation or prosecution of an offense lying within the exclusive jurisdiction of the circuit court:

It is expected that the Pope County District Judge shall conduct felony bond hearings (pursuant to Rules 8.1, 8.2, 8.3, 8.4, 8.5, 9.1, 9.3, 9.4 of the Arkansas Rules of Criminal Procedure) every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday morning. The hearings are held in a small courtroom inside the Pope County Jail located at #3 Emergency Lane, Russellville, AR. The hearings will be conducted either in person or via an electronic method. The electronic method will utilize Zoom or another application utilizing a screen, audio and microphone in the courtroom where the defendants are located allowing the defendants to interact with the court and any other participants via the electronic method. The District court Judge shall conduct these hearings unless arrangements are made for the hearings to be held by one of the Circuit Judges.

Further, the "Criminal Matters" referred to in §6(b)(5) of Arkansas Supreme Court Administrative Order 18 shall be performed by the Pope County District Court Judge on an "as needed" basis.

Probation revocation preliminary hearings are to be held by the District Court Judge on Mondays, Wednesdays or Fridays in accordance with A.C.A. § 16-93-307.

Digital Audio Recording Equipment

Digital audio recording equipment is not utilized.

4. SPECIALTY COURTS

Currently no specialty courts are conducted.

5. OTHER PROGRAMS OR DOCKETS.

The District Court Judge presides over a probation program.

The Pope County District Court utilizes a probation clerk employed for Russellville City dockets and Pope County dockets for the purpose of utilizing alternative sanctions and programs to facilitate alternative sanctions for indigent individuals as well as utilizing public service work and other programs (Adult Education; mental health counseling; substance abuse counseling; financial literacy programs; and other rehabilitative programs) as part of its sentencing alternatives. The probation clerk will oversee individuals placed on probation and report to the Court on an individual's progress and compliance in such program(s). The program will be part of the Court's regularly scheduled dockets.

6. EFFECTIVE DATE.
