a. Type of specialty docket and description of its operation:

Faulkner and Van Buren County Sobriety Courts operate within the treatment framework recommended by the National Association of Drug Court Professionals for the treatment of high risk/high need repeat violators of A.C.A.

5-65-103, Boating or Driving While Intoxicated, an Unclassified Misdemeanor (typically Second or subsequent offenders, or First Offense DWI Offenders with a very high blood alcohol result at the time of arrest.). Sobriety Court uses a stakeholder-team approach to treatment and supervision. Persons who screen into the program are evaluated for pre-plea supervision for a period of three months. During this time the participants begin treatment and are habituated to the lifestyle supervison provided by our probation officers. Once pled into the program, the participants will make progress through the four phases of the program. Maximum supervision and counselling occur beginning at plea. Both of these forms of supervison are reduced to some degree as participants phase up. By the time a participant has reaced Phase Four, supervision and counselling are minimal with the goal of preparing the participant to reenter society without treatment support from the program, or with appropriate therapeutic treatment sought out by the individual.

Sanctions and rewards are utilized to punish or modify bad behavior or reward correct choices. Hefty doses of community service are required of the participant in exchange for graduation and mitigation of the fines and jail time associated with the standard sentences for DWI offenses in this judicial district. Staffings occur immediately before the Sobriety Court Participants appear before the judge. Frequent updates of important issues are shared by treatment or probation between court appearances with the rest of the team, if something needs immediate attention.

Treatment is focused on both individual and group settings, with additional treatment options considered and ordered if necessary to aid the partifcipant in leading a law abiding lifestyle (i.e., Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, Harbor House, etc). Sanctions range from writing a paper on a topic relating to a violation, extra community service, up to jail sanctions. Typcial jail sanctions are 48 hours or less, occastionally rising to 96 hours if merited. Continued lack of adherence by a participant to a treatment regieme will result in the removal of the participant from the program and individualized sentencing on the original charges.

- d. Use of court resources. Each member of the treatment team was consulted in setting up the program and its operation; scheduling has been coordinated; and the necessary resources are available. The Team consists of Conway Counselling and Wellness (CCW) for mental and medical treatments. CCW utilized board certified therapist, and psychiatric physician supervision of medical issues. As noted above, CCW handles both individual and group counselling for participants. For participants with insurance issues, interns acting under the

All cases are tried, or pleas accepted with the defendant being followed by District Court probation and /or the representative of the STOPDV program to assure compliance with all treatment orders. While we have no treatment providers who are funded by the program, the STOPDV coordinator arranges treatment for the defendant's with outside resources.

e. Sources of funding:

There is no outside funding but for resources obtained by and for STOPDV program. All other team members are funded by the various offices. All costs of treatment are the responsibility of the participant.

supervision of licensed therapists are often utilized until insurance is in place. Prosecutors, city attorneys, devoted private counsel in Faulkner County and public defender in Van Buren County participate in decision making over each case. The judge, court personnel, and Sheriff's Deputies in Faulkner County round out the treatment team. The judge has the final decision over any issue.

e. Sources of funding: Faulkner and Van Buren Counties, the Cities of Clinton and Conway, the Arkansas Highway Safety Office, federal and state grants for training, and the Van Buren County Public Defender's Office for matters in Van Buren County.
